Tribunal.



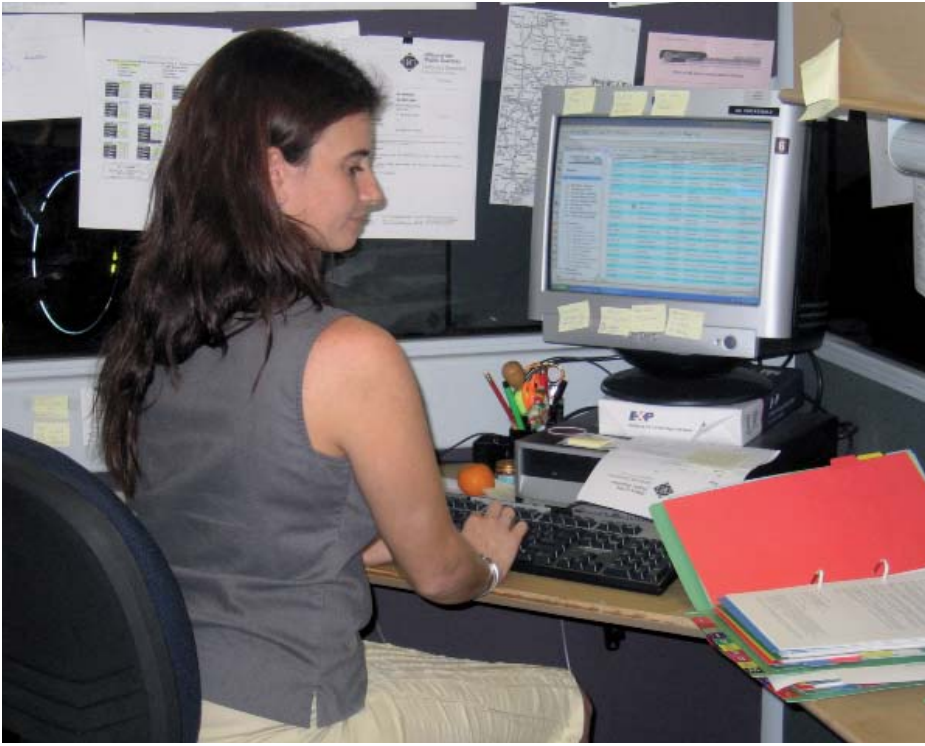
The Guardianship
